The fourteenth amendment to the U.S. constitution provides that a citizen is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. The dictionaries inform us that jurisdiction means power and control. They're controlled by the government.

In the United States, there are three categories of behavior. Those categories are required behavior, prohibited behavior, and regulated behavior. If the government catches a citizen engaging in prohibited behavior, then the government will punish that citizen. If the government catches a citizen engaging in regulated behavior contrary to the regulations, then the government will punish that citizen.

If a citizen refuses to submit to the punishment, then the government will initiate the use of force against that citizen, to compel him to submit to the punishment. If he resists the use of force, then the government will escalate the use of force. If he continues to resist the use of force, then the government will continue to escalate the use of force. It will continue to do so, without limit, until either the citizen submits to the punishment, or the citizen is dead.

In consideration of such circumstances and consequences that are inherent in citizenship in the United States, one thing is absolutely clear. Citizenship must necessarily be voluntary. If it isn't voluntary, if people are compelled to be citizens by force, fraud, deception, manipulation, misrepresentation, coercion, or by any other method, then the involuntary nature of such citizenship reveals that the United States is an authoritarian, dictatorial police state.
